

# E-IMPORT DUTY CONCESSIONS



Under the Third Schedule of the Customs Act, Chapter 78:01, Import Duty Concessions are granted to qualifying manufacturing and processing companies in Trinidad and Tobago.

Import Duty Concessions allow such companies to receive exemptions on import/customs duties for items that they import as supplies for their manufacturing or processing needs. These items include raw materials, machinery, equipment and packaging material.

# **Users of this Service (Applicants)**

Companies engaged in manufacturing or processing industries can apply for Import Duty Concessions. Eligibility is also dependent on the following criteria:

- 1. The company must be incorporated in Trinidad and Tobago.
- 2. The company must be VAT and BIR registered.
- 3. Part of the production of the final output must be done locally.

## **Application Process**

### **Stage 1: Application**

- 1. To access the SEW System, an applicant must first obtain a ttconnect identification number and sign up on TTBizLink for the relevant e-service(s) he/she wishes to use, such as the Import Duty Concessions e-service. The applicant can then also apply for a TTBizLink ID.
- 2. The Applicant acting on behalf of the company then submits an electronic application to the Ministry of Trade and Industry (MTI) via the TTBizLink website **www.ttbizlink.gov.tt**.

3. The Applicant must scan and upload the Registration Certificate or Certificate of Incorporation unto the TTBizLink e-application.

### Stage 2: Processing


- 1. The Investment Directorate of the MTI reviews the application, along with the supporting documents.
- 2. The Investment Directorate of the MTI prepares an Evaluation Report through TTBizLink.

#### Stage 3: Approval

- 1. The Evaluation Report is forwarded to the Permanent Secretary (PS) and then to the Minister of Trade and Industry through TTBizLink for consideration.
- 2. The Applicant receives an e-mail notification if there is a query at any stage in the approval process. He/she will also receive an immediate e-mail notification when a final decision is made concerning his/her application.
- 3. An official letter is sent to the applicant to inform him/her of the Minister's decision.

#### **Benefits**

- Simplified process with 'one-stop' interface for all applications.
